<u>Computing</u>	Using technology items in the classroom is embedded throughout every term in continuous provision. Children have access to interactive screens and laptops with activities and games which link to their learning. This enables children to become more confident using some of the technology that they will use further on in their school life.					
<u>Pre-Writing Skills</u>	Across the year the children have access to lots of items within continuous provision to develop their fine motor skills including tweezers, cutting skills, using pegs, colouring etc. Children take part in 'Funky Fingers' activities every morning and develop their pre-writing shape formation. In Brambles, we also use the 'Squiggle Early Writing Programme' which prepares children to write in a fun, developmental and physically appropriate way.
